Provincial Management Team Report

Reviewing the year 2008, St. John Council for Ontario has had its challenges and its successes. Through the combined efforts of the branches, members, volunteers and provincial office, this Council has been able to grow with an increase of 3.6% over the previous year in the areas of first aid and related health care training and product sales. Congratulations to the following branches who contributed to this growth achieving year over year increases in excess of 15%: Barrie, Woodstock, Niagara Falls and Grey Bruce. Unfortunately the bottom line was a deficit as a result primarily of investment losses reinforcing the need for continued efforts to maintain and potentially increase the proportional contribution from fundraising and donations.

Achievements in 2008 include a number of areas such as the continuing improvements made to our innovative approach to leadership development known as "Empowered Leadership" and its roll-out as a full program noting that the key to our continued viability lies in our future leaders. The PMT hosted its annual Branch workshops in the spring of the year to identify and communicate new tools, practices and policies designed to make our organization more effective. MFR, now a well established program, is meeting the needs of the many communities that we serve.

Car seat safety continues to be a growing opportunity for St. John along with the Therapy Dog program as it builds on the strength and knowledge of our experienced members. The Youth program and our Youth Leadership continues to engage our young people with the help of a workshop designed to promote development and networking for current youth program leaders. The Automatic External Defibrillators <AED> program with the public and with the Ontario Government continues to make a valuable contribution to the organization. Following on the success in 2007 of our "Heroes" program, 2008 saw the release of updated marketing and public awareness materials designed to position St. John Ontario as a leader in first aid and health promotion.

The Standards and Support Committee in concert with the Provincial Management Team <PMT> provide consultative advice

and support to assist with the delivery of St. John Ontario's key programs and services - Medical First Response <MFR>, Therapy Dogs, Youth, Campus Response, Emergency Response, Search and Rescue, Car Seat Safety, First Aid and Health Promotion, Volunteer Development, Marketing, Sales, Communications, and Community Relations.

The Council Board and PMT continue to find the use of Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) a valuable tool to assess the performance of the branches. While many branches are meeting or exceeding performance expectations, we want to ensure that any branch that finds itself challenged and not performing to their optimum ability for a variety of reasons is identified early on and provided the resources it needs to be successful. Branches also have the opportunity, through the PMT, to complete a pro-active assessment of their own operation. This assessment is intended to objectively identify opportunities for improvement and to correct downward trends early-on before they evolve into ones that are arduous and time consuming for all involved.

2008 saw the continuing investment of time and effort in the development of better governance practices and improved leadership to achieve sustainable viability. The strategic plan renewed in 2007 continued in 2008. A part of this plan is the strengthening of our organizational structure by the encouragement to establish new Community Service Units to form the core for growing new Service Centres that could then potentially become a branch.

In conclusion, the PMT would like to again thank the many volunteers and employees throughout Ontario that continue to provide exceptional support to St. John Ambulance provincially. Thank you to our colleagues at Council especially our Council Chair, Kirk Corkery, Council Board members, Committee members, and the provincial office for their insight, leadership and support over this last year. We look forward to celebrating 2009 as our 125th Anniversary serving Ontario.

Treasurer's Report

The 2008 St. John Council for Ontario financial statements* include the total assets, liabilities, results of operations, and cash flows of the Provincial Office as well as the Branches and Community Service Units across the province. The operating results for the year were a negative \$0.9 million [2007 - positive \$0.3 million] after including an investment loss of \$0.5 million and a gain on disposal of capital assets of \$0.3 million.

Total revenue of \$16.4 million [2007 - \$16.1 million] represents an increase of 2% over the prior year figure. The statement of operations show \$12.8 million [2007 - \$12.4 million] pertaining to training and product sales. 2008 training program revenues amounted to \$11.5 million [2007 - \$11.2 million] and store sales totaled \$1.3 million [2007 - \$1.2 million] - in aggregate, an increase of 3.6% over the prior year total. The graph on the opposite page illustrates how these revenues represent the largest portion of total revenue for 2008. On a combined basis, these sources of revenue are expected to improve in 2009.

Total audited expenses for 2008 of \$17.0 million [2007 - \$16.5 million] is an increase of 3% from the prior year figure. The statement of operations included in the audited financial statements presents only one number for operating expenses. This is the result of not having a consistent presentation of expenses across the over thirty separate financial statements that are consolidated to produce the St. John Council of Ontario financial statements. Ontario Council continues to work nationally in the development of a more standardized format of financial statement presentation for use across Canada.

For 2008, St. John Council for Ontario had a net deficiency of expenses over revenue from operations of \$0.9 million compared to a \$0.3 million excess in 2007. Reflective of the poor investment markets, an investment loss of \$0.5 million was incurred in 2008 compared to a positive investment return of \$0.4 million in 2007 a negative change of almost \$1 million between the two years.

As with the prior year, the 2008 balance sheet of St. John Council for Ontario remains strong with assets totaling \$26.3 million. These assets consist of investments (\$16.1 million), capital assets and licenses for software (\$4.4 million), and current assets (\$5.8 million).


As part of our governance at Ontario Council, we employ independent investment managers and monitor their performance on a routine basis.

The Council Provincial Office of St. John strives to improve operations and provide value-added service to the Branches. The Branches continue to identify, implement and share ideas for operational efficiencies. The staff at the Branches and Council Provincial Office work hard providing support to the volunteers throughout the year. Training continues to improve the standard of our instructor service throughout Ontario.

I would like to again convey my appreciation to the Branches for their support in providing their year-end results on a timely basis. As well, I would like to take this opportunity express my gratitude to the members of Council's Resources Committee, the external auditors and the staff at Provincial Office for their efforts in 2008 which has been a challenging year not only for St. John, but for the entire world.

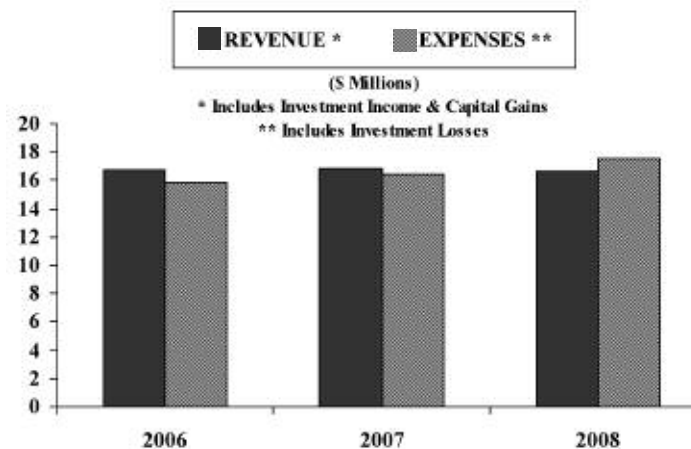
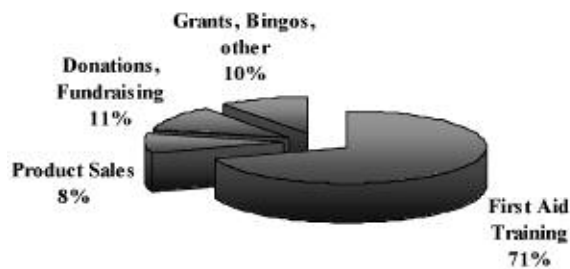

There are some volunteers whose work is less visible - the many men and women who perform our administrative, board and committee work.

Branch members include corporate representatives, members of local municipal offices, members of local boards of education and emergency services and all aspects of the community.

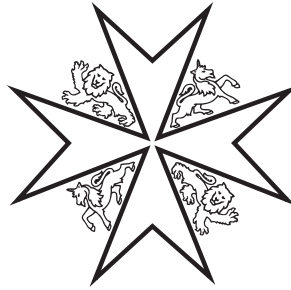
