With the boom in construction activity and growth in safety cultures overall, the NLCSA and St. John Ambulance moved to a larger and more accessible training facility in January to better serve their west coast clientele.

The larger joint training facility is just one of the measures taken to advance safety services. "The addition of a full-time NLCSA Safety Advisor dedicated to the west coast and the Association's new Mobile Practical Training Unit are two other measures that will enhance construction safety services, not just in Corner Brook, but throughout the whole region", said NLCSA Chief Executive Officer, Jackie Manuel. "The importance of working together towards safety is something that we take very seriously. By working closely with our members, associate members and St. John Ambulance we are, collectively, partnering to save lives."

An Open House is being hosted on Wednesday, April 13th from 3:00 to 6:00 pm at the new NLCSA and St. John Ambulance joint training facility located at 10 Main Street, Suite 202, Corner Brook. Everyone is welcome to attend.
