HEROES RECOGNIZED

St. John's, June 10th, 2010: St. John Ambulance will honour 7 Newfoundlanders and Labradorians with Life Saving Awards at an Investiture Life Saving Awards Ceremony on Thursday, June 10th at 2:30 PM at the Anglican Cathedral in St. John's. Another 24 individuals and/or organizations will be recognized for their humanitarian contributions to the citizens of the province with Certificates of Commendation, Priory Votes of Thanks, and The Dr. Cluny Macpherson Centennial Awards. Mrs. Joyce Hart of Botwood, NL will be promoted to Dame of Grace with the Order of St. John.

Her exemplary efforts in all aspects of community services have contributed to the continued successes enjoyed by the organization. She has served with St. John Ambulance for over 28 years, including membership on the Board of Directors for over 14 years, and has worked to encourage continued involvement of Order members through the Fellowship movement. Her ongoing commitment and dedication are duly recognized with a Promotion to Dame of Grace.

Mr. Darrell Dalley, Mr. Anthony Edison, Mr. Paul Fudge, and Ms. Gina Andrews will receive a Life Saving Award for their quick response on December 4, 2009 in Gander, NL.

These four individuals teamed up and used their first aid skills to save a life. Off-duty firefighters Paul Fudge & Darrell Dalley, retired paramedic Anthony Edison, and respiratory technician Gina Andrews were attending a social event at the local fire station with colleagues and friends when suddenly, one of the guests collapsed. Anthony Edison was first to respond. He quickly assessed the casualty and found him to be unconscious, not breathing and without pulse. Alerting others at the event, he began CPR. Mr. Edison was immediately joined by several of the guests who assisted with CPR, providing chest compression and ventilations. The Automated External Defibrillator (AED) was retrieved. Working as a team, they shocked and successfully revived the casualty. Without this life-saving intervention, the casualty may not have survived. Mr. Paul Fudge, Mr. Darrell Dalley, Mr. Anthony Edison, and Ms. Gina Andrews are to be commended for their teamwork and for their knowledge and use of first aid in saving a life.
